The main theme of this year was STEM for Viksit and Atm Nirbhar Bharat. However there were seven sub-themes. These included: Sustainable Agriculture, Waste Management and alternative to Plastics, Green Energy, Emerging Technologies, Recreational Mathematical Modellings, Health & Hygiene and Water Conservation and Management.

On day one, this mega academic event witnessed participation from 72 schools with 109 exhibits. Out of these, 56 models were shortlisted, 29 from category-1 (VI to VIII) and 27 models from category -2 (IX to XI). The panel of six judges included Dr. Gurdit Singh expert IOT, Machine Learning from Punjab Agriculture University, Dr. Saravpreet Singh Khaira expert in Medical Management, Dr. Maninder Kaur expert in Food and Processing from Punjab Agriculture University, Dr. Rajvir Kaur Sraw expert in water treatment method from Guru Nanak Dev Engineering College, Dr. Gurkirat Kaur expert in Nanotechnology PAU, Mr Sukhminder Singh expert in mathematics from GNDEC. Answering to the volley of questions from judges, the budding scientists answered very confidently reflecting clarity of scientific concepts and principles.

The best 14 exhibits were selected, seven from each of two categories. These have been sent for the CBSE National Science exhibition. The event came to an end with feet tapping bhangra.

Box: Take from Ignited minds: Having reached an innovative platform, the participants were looking very confident to explain their well worked models based on different scientific principles.

Gurmilap Singh Brar a XI Medical student from St Xavier World School, NFL township Bathinda who was there with Zero waste sustainable Agriculture said, "Its name is Aqua Helio Fusion Matrix. It is a combination of four projects including Spirulina Culture, Bio filter, Mushroom Culture, Hydroponics and Biogas. I spent about 5000 rupees and it took about 15 days to prepare it."

Explaining their model of Pyrolysis Fuel from Plastic enthusiastically Ashutosh and Rudhima both XI students of Green Land Convent School New Subhash Nagar said, "We can control plastic pollution with this." However Anav and Suvrat both class IX students from Delhi Public School, Jalandhar who were there with Guardian Eye said, "we have prepared anti drone detective system, which is far cheaper than Indian army's imported systems. We have sent proposal to Indian army through a know army officer and wish it get selected." Explaining a model - Smart Gesture Glove for communication, prepared for disabled people Paramjit Singh and Harshpreet Singh both students of Guru Nanak Mission Public School Dallan Bhogpur in Jalandhar district said, "It took about three months to prepare it. The innovative idea was given by one of our teachers and we worked on it day and night."

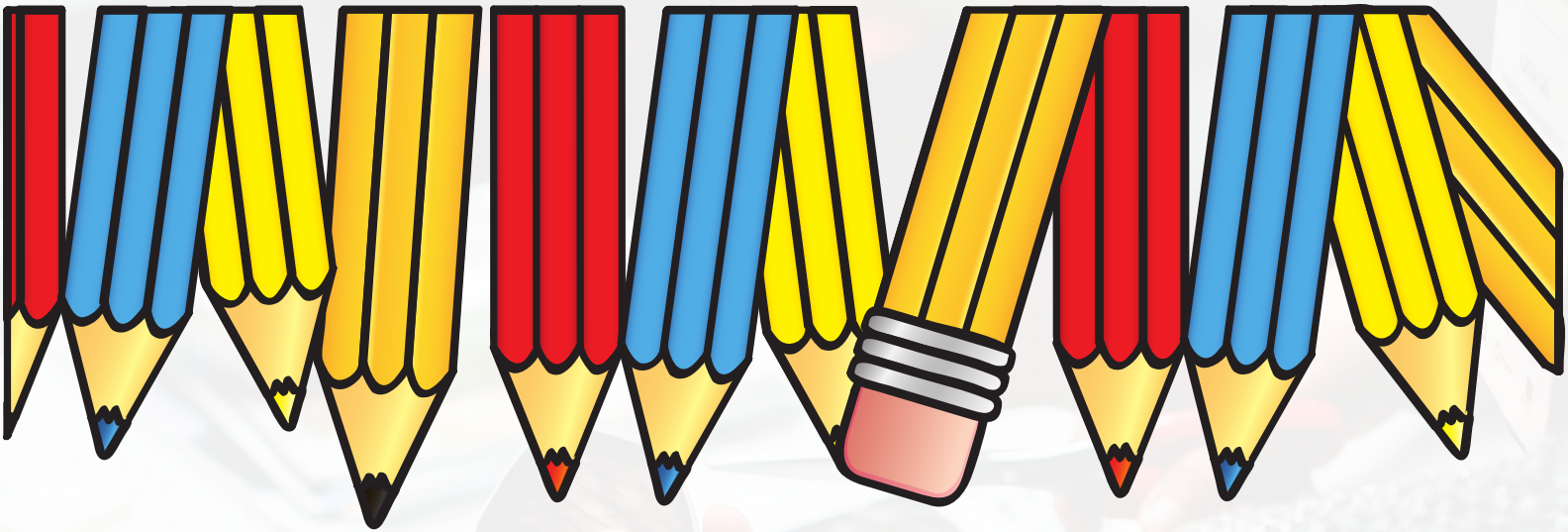

Sustainable Living: Myth or possibility

Imagine a world where we live in harmony with our planet, a place where actions are conscious and sustainable. With our overpopulated world which has been witnessing increased industrialization, it is the high time to opt for sustainable living. For some it may sound a very towering goal, seems that only a selected few can achieve. They might argue that it is a myth, that it's too expensive, too complicated, or too idealistic. But it is a misconception. It is a mindset shift. It's about recognizing the impact of our daily choices on the environment, society, and the economy. Sustainable living is not only possible but necessary also.

Robert Swan said rightly, "The greatest threat to our planet is the belief that someone else will save it." To start with we can make small changes in our daily life at our own. We can reduce our energy consumption by turning off lights, using energy-efficient appliances, and insulating our homes, conserving water, reducing waste by recycling and avoiding single-use plastics. We have the technology, the knowledge, and the resources to live sustainably. What we need is the will to make it happen. Gradually it can go beyond individual actions. Policies supporting sustainable living formulated by Governments, corporations, and institutions can be implemented strictly by roping in different Non Government Organizations. This way we will be killing two birds with one stone, preserve our natural resources and shun away unemployment. Eventually we will recognize that our actions have good results and we have the power to generate better for generations to come.

One of the most significant ways we can reduce our impact on environment is transitioning to renewable energy resources. Solar and windpower are clean renewable alternatives to fossil fuels that can help in reducing pollution. We have a live example in our own district where a significant canal top solar PV project on the Sidhwan canal, near Doaraha was made functional in the year 2017. It avoided land acquisition and utilized space over the canal for solar generation. It provides 2.50 Megawatt electricity which is pollution free and thus reducing CO₂ emissions.

There is a myth about green buildings that these are very costly. But reality is that in the long term, these have 30 to 40% utility value and resale value is also too high. CII-Sohrabji Godrej Green Business Centre in Hyderabad is country's first LEED Platinum rated green building and Indira Paryawaran Bhawan, Delhi a net zero energy government building. In such buildings there is no requirement of ACs, water is recycled. In the case when there is no power supply, there is always back up. Resale value of such buildings is too much.

Transportation is another major contributor to green house gas emission. By choosing to walk and opting for public transportation we can reduce our dependence on fossil fuels and can improve air quality. Polling of the vehicles in residential areas is also a solution which will not only save time and energy but will also enhance quality of air. We are from a country which boasts of having world's first Carbon Neutral baby who got her name registered in the Asia Book of Record. She is Aadavi from Tamil Nadu whose parents Dinesh SP and Janaga Nandini achieved this by planting over 6000 fruit trees to offset her lifetime carbon emission before she turned one. Following this the Tamil Nadu government declared Aadavi a child Ambassador for green Mission 2024. So if her parents can, why not others?

We all need to wake up from slumber. As said Niall Fitzgerald

, "Sustainability is here to stay, or we may not be" Working together with conscious choices, supporting sustainable policies, and inspiring each others to work in tandem for this common cause is the need of hour.
